

“Do I have a valid photo ID for voting?”

- **Do you have a current or expired Tennessee driver’s license?**

If it has a photo, the voter has a valid form of ID.

If the voter has no driver’s license:

- **Do you have a Tennessee handgun carry permit with your photo?**

If yes, the voter has a valid form of ID

- **Do you have any other form of photo ID issued by the state of Tennessee?** (Examples: Tennessee state employee ID, public university faculty/staff ID (remember, college student IDs are not acceptable)

If yes, the voter has a valid form of ID.

- **Do you have a photo ID issued by any other state?**

If yes, the voter has a valid form of ID.

- **Do you have a current or expired U.S. Passport?**

If yes, the voter has a valid form of ID.

- **Do you have a U.S. Military ID with your photo?** (Examples: Common Access Card, Veteran Identification Card, U.S. Uniformed Services Card)

If yes, the voter has a valid form of ID.

- **Do you have any other form of photo ID issued by the federal government?** (Examples: Federal government employee ID or subcontractor ID if issued by the federal government, U.S. Passport Card, various form of ID issued by TSA)

If yes, the voter has a valid form of ID.

If the voter has none of the forms of photo ID listed above:

- A free photo ID for voting may be obtained at the nearest participating driver service center. To obtain a free photo ID, the voter will need:

- A voter registration card,
- Proof of citizenship (such as a birth certificate)—it must be an ORIGINAL; no copies will be accepted, and
- Two proofs of Tennessee residency (such as a copy of a utility bill, vehicle registration/title, or bank statement).

- If the voter has a non-photo driver’s license, the Department of Safety will add a photo free of charge or issue a separate photo ID that satisfies the requirements of the voter photo ID law.
